Multiple Realities of America: Progress, Stagnation, or Regression

ASBS invites students currently enrolled in undergraduate degree programs to submit original research for the undergraduate student paper competition. "The Call" encompasses educational, social, health, psychological, economic, political, behavioral, agricultural, anthropological, philosophical, and other factors that impact and promote social change. Papers may be based on either quantitative or qualitative research.

In order to be considered for participation in the competition, students should submit the following:

- the entire paper, including title, abstract, text with tables and figures as appropriate, and a reference list;
- a cover letter that includes the name of the paper's author, local and permanent addresses, telephone number, email address, major, classification, academic department, and college or university; and
- name, title, address, telephone, and an e-mail address of the student's advisor(s) sponsoring the submission.

Students who participate in the competition MUST be registered for the conference and must present their papers at the conference on Thursday, March 7.

Papers will be evaluated on the thesis question; content and development; format and organization; grammar, punctuation, and spelling; and overall quality of research. All papers will be assessed through *Turnitin* to assure originality and lack of plagiarism. Presentations will be evaluated on knowledge of topic, information/content, organization and creativity, delivery, interaction with audience/eye contact, time management.

The deadline for submissions of competitive papers is **January 14, 2019.** Please submit paper as an attachment in Microsoft Word via electronic mail to Dr. Thomas Calhoun at thomas.c.calhoun@jsums.edu.
